Across ten days of exploring Paris and seven structured writing workshops, you'll experience a deep immersion in the ideas, techniques and craft of writing memoir. This course has been designed to extend and enrich all levels of experience.

Through expert instruction and the support of a small group of like-minded travellers and writers, Memoir Writing in Paris is a transformative experience.

Each morning you'll devote time to your project in workshops held in a central Parisian apartment, and in the afternoons you'll be free to explore the city that inspired history's greatest revolutionaries, poets, writers and artists with the help of our erudite local guides.

Whether you've always dreamed of writing but don't know where to start; have a story to tell but want guidance on form and technique; or have a well established writing practice and seek new frontiers of inspiration – our writing sojourn in Paris is for you.



In the city where Proust penned In Search of Lost Time and Anaïs Nin kept her revolutionary diary, your own stories will find their voice.


Set during Autumn, the season of memories and recollection - of 'mellow fruitfulness' as Keats once put it - our retreat is designed to make you feel like a local Parisian writer and find meaning where the past meets the present on the page.

In the workshops you'll write and share ideas in a creative, supportive and encouraging environment, learning about the art and craft of memoir writing. In a one-on-one consultation with Patti, you'll be able to discuss your project in detail and receive personalised writing guidance.

In the afternoons and evenings, you're free to explore the city made famous by Balzac, Flaubert, Hemingway, Stein, Rimbaud, Baudelaire, Sand, and de Beauvoir. Perhaps you'll sit and write on a café terrace with a coffee or a glass of wine, or ask your dedicated local guide, Mélissa – a Parisian jazz chanteuse and writer - for some insider tips about where to find inspiration.

You'll also receive a lecture on the history and culture of Paris and a literary tour with an expert on French literary history. On your day off from workshops, Mélissa will show you some of Paris' best - but often overlooked - cultural sites and treat you to a Parisian lunch.

You will visit some local literary haunts and engage in stimulating discussions over drinks, as great thinkers have always done in Paris. For our Welcome Lunch and Farewell Dinner we'll dine in some of Paris' most historic belle époque bistros which have hosted generations of writers before us.









Patti Miller is a best-selling author and Australia's leading memoirwriting mentor.






France is the birthplace of modern memoir, the country where Montaigne wrote his *Essays* about the nature of Self, and where Rousseau lived most of the extraordinary life he describes in *Confessions*. Through the combination of structured workshops, one-on-one consultation, and personal exploration, you too will discover your voice and story.

Across seven mornings, you'll attend your writing workshop with Patti in a charming, centrally located apartment. Here you'll learn about topics such as Beginning Again, Original Memory, Texture and Detail, the Narrator, Narrative Structure, the Difficulties of Truth Telling, Organising Your Material, Structural Trouble-Shooting, the Borderlands with Fiction, Travel Memoir, and many others. Each day will follow a rhythmic pattern with classes, shaped around Patti's updated edition of Writing True Stories, and a curated selection of readings which will be provided before you depart for Paris.

You'll be given daily writing exercises and prompts based on the course content which provide you with ample opportunities for development and growth. These are designed to help you tap into your memories and get to the core of what it is you want to write about. You will also share your work with the group, in a warm and encouraging environment.

Parisian-style morning teas, with tea coffee and treats from the local pâtisserie, will be provided in each workshop.

You'll also have the opportunity to schedule an individual writing consultation with Patti. During this time you can discuss your personal writing project in-depth without interruption. This is an invaluable opportunity to sort through and solve those writing blocks with a memoirwriting expert, all in the unique ambience of a Parisian café.









What level of writing experience is required?

This course is designed for people who have already begun their writing journey or have some idea about the story they want to tell, but it is not a pre-requisite that you participate in a writing workshop prior to the tour. Having said that, we do believe a writing course with Patti before joining Writing Memoir in Paris is an ideal preparation for the intensive writing journey in Paris. Details about Patti's writing courses can be found on the Faber Academy website (faberwritingacademy.com.au/ course/writing_memoir) or Patti's own website (lifestories.com.au). We also recommend that you glance through Patti's text Writing True Stories before booking so that vou understand her creative approach to writing workshops.

Do I have to share my work?

Workshopping – that is, reading and discussing each other's writing in a supportive and creative environment – is a central aspect of the course. It gives each writer the essential experience of being part of a writing community, and it will also build your confidence as a writer.

Should I bring a laptop?

If you prefer to work on a laptop you are welcome to do so, but during the course you will not be using a desk so please consider if this will be the most comfortable way for you to sit. We find that many people prefer to use a pen and notebook for classes, then transcribe their work to their laptop later.

What other materials do I need?

The writing workshops will be based on Patti's updated edition of Writing True Stories, which will be your textbook during the course. Please make sure you purchase it before leavina Australia. You will receive a 10% discount on this book, along with Patti's other works, if purchased through Better Read Than Dead.

Before departure, you'll also receive a curated reading guide which will be referred to in the classes, as well as an extended reading list to facilitate your immersion in the literary culture of Paris and the art of memoir.



This is a writing sojourn for independent-minded travellers seeking the experience of living like a local writer in Paris, rather than those seeking a fully escorted tour. At the same time, it is for people who enjoy stimulating conversations with like-minded company, who share a love of writing, travel and literature.

During the retreat you'll be staying in a well-appointed, deluxe studio apartment at the Citadines Les Halles, which is located in a lively central location in the historic heart of Paris with a wealth of shopping, food and cultural sites at your fingertips. Your apartment is within an 'apartment hotel', which means you will easily be able to connect with your fellow writers or enjoy your own private space and independence. You'll have a double bed (or single, if you have opted for twinshare), desk, kitchenette and WIFI along with all other 4-star amenities including access to a

laundering service and a 24-hr concierge. A thoughtful welcome pack will be in you room on arrival providing you with the essentials (and a few treats!) to make you feel at home in Paris. Breakfast in the restaurant downstairs is included in your package.

You will walk a few minutes to the class venue each morning, using one of our maps as a guide. As you settle into your daily routines of the writer's life, you'll have the pleasure of getting to know your own local neighbourhood from the boulangerie where you buy your baquettes, to the café or bar where you'll sit with a coffee or apéro and scribble observations in your notebook.

MONDAY 14TH SEPT ARRIVAL IN PARIS

On arrival at your well-appointed aparthotel in Paris, you'll receive a **welcome pack** with immediate food requirements, Navigo métro pass and general orientation information.

After some time to unpack and settle in, we'll rendezvous at an iconic Parisian café in the evening for **flight recovery drinks**. Your Tour Manager, Mélissa, will be available all day to answer any questions.

TUESDAY 15TH SEPT WORKSHOP ONE + ORIENTATION

Our writing journey begins! After breakfast, walk to our nearby workshop venue using the map provided, arriving by 9.15am for a 9.30am start.

During class, we'll have a talk on French memoir by Patti, an introductory writing exercise, and potted history of Paris from your local tour manager Mélissa, who will give us an orientation to Paris and a refresher on using the métro. You'll also have the chance to introduce your own writing projects, and schedule your individual consultation sessions with Patti.

A **Welcome Brunch** at the workshop venue will complete the morning. Champagne in the middle of the day? Oui, bien sûr!

Free afternoon and evening.




WEDNESDAY 16TH SEPT WORKSHOP TWO + WELCOME LUNCH

Meet at the class venue at **9.45am** for a **10am start**, finishing at **1pm**. In today's **workshop** we'll explore getting started and accessing 'Proustian' memory, with a break for coffee and a treat from the local patisserie.

After class, we'll go together to a belle époque brasserie for our **Welcome Lunch**.

THURSDAY 17TH SEPT WORKSHOP THREE + LITERARY SOIRÉE

Attend your workshop from 10am to 1pm, with our usual break for morning tea. Today we'll learn how important awareness, observation and the senses are for recreating the texture of 'lived reality' on the page, using detail and scene. The afternoon will be free for writing, exploring Paris or your individual consultation with Patti.

In the evening we'll enjoy a **literary soirée**, either at one of the English-speaking bookshops or at our own apartment venue.



FRIDAY 18TH SEPT WORKSHOP FOUR + LITERARY RAMBLE

Today's workshop, from 10am to 1pm, will be an introduction to the genre of travel memoir so that you may find the words to explore your own experience of Paris. We will look at what to pack in your travel memoir suitcase – and what to leave at home.



In the afternoon we'll take a **literary ramble** walking tour with an expert on French literature and Paris.

SATURDAY 19TH SEPT HIDDEN GEMS OF PARIS

Today after **breakfast**, we'll meet Mélissa and head to Maison Balzac. a writer's house museum in the former residence of French novelist Honoré de Balzac, which gives an intimate view into the cultural and social dynamics of 19th-century France (and boasts a fantastic view of the Tour Eiffel as well as delightful **teahouse**). On the way to lunch we'll walk through the enchantingly atmospheric **Passy cemetery**, where one can find the final resting place of many French cultural luminaries. For those who wish to keep exploring, Mélissa will be happy to share many other hidden gems in this charming arrondissement such as smaller specialist museums and galleries which are often overlooked by tourists, as well as shops and cafés.

The rest of the day is free to keep exploring, or catch up on your writing.



SUNDAY 20TH SEPT WORKSHOP FIVE + WRITERS' NIGHT IN PARIS

In this morning's workshop, 10am to 1pm, we will extend the area of memoir into the rich genre of the personal essay, where the idea behind the writing is the driving force.

Free afternoon.

In the evening, we'll meet for cocktails at a secret venue to experience an authentic aspect of the **Parisian** writer's life.

Today in our workshop, 10am to **1pm**, we will start exploring structure and form, starting with beauty and truth, as we always must.

To secure your place, a 30% deposit is required within 7 days of receiving your booking form. We will receipt your payment and issue a tax invoice showing your payment and any balance due. CANCELLATION

Please read the following terms and conditions carefully as they form part of all bookings except to the extent approved by variation in writing approved by a director of Better Read Tours Pty Ltd ABN 16 621 237 885 (BRT).

Prices: All prices are subject to availability and can be withdrawn or amended at any time without notice. Price and inclusions valid on tour dates only.

Amendment/Cancellation Fees: We reserve the right to charge you for any amendment or cancellation made by you (regardless of the reason). These charges can be up to 100% of the cost of the booking, regardless of whether travel has commenced. BRT reserves the right to charge cancellation fees over and above those charged by wholesalers, tour operators, airlines, cruise companies, etc. Fees may also apply where a booking is changed or tickets are reissued.

Deposit & Final Payment: To secure your reservation you will be required to pay a deposit of 30% of the total tour price, within 7 days of receiving your booking form. Your deposit forms the first part of three payment installations which must be received by us before documents are issued. The second installment is required by 10th April 2026, and the final payment is required 12th June 2026. Subject to the Australian Consumer Law, the deposit is nonrefundable.
